By joining IASS you are participating in the exciting and challenging family sport of "Airgun / Airsoft speed shooting". IASS is a Youth & Adult Development Program that teaches the safe handling of pistols, semi auto rifles and shotguns while at the same time developing positive life skills through a supportive environment taught by trained and supportive adult coaches. The IASS programs have been founded as a feeder programs to the SPP/Steel Challenge, 3GUN Nation and IDPA in order to bring the same type of positive life skills and team spirit to the handgun, semi auto rifle and tactical shotgun shooting sports.

Shoot Right is the governing body for IASS. Shoot Right raises money and other resources to support youth and adult shooting programs as a whole. The shooting and hunting industry understand that today's youth are the future of our sport and we enjoy tremendous support from the hunting and shooting industry. For this reason it is very beneficial for the junior shooters to participate in this sport along with the adults.

The backbone of the International Air Shooting Sports is the Parents, Adults, and Volunteers who organize and run the program on the local and state level. Any successful youth or adult program will always have a few dedicated passionate adults working in a leadership and guidance role. The amount of time, energy, and financial resources that these dedicated adults contribute to the program is staggering. However, when you meet the wonderful young athletes that the program produces, you will understand quickly why it is worth it and why they do what they do. The participants in the International Air Shooting Sports are the greatest youth and adults you would ever want to meet.

This handbook has been prepared to guide you through the IASS shooting programs from registration to the completion of the IASS National & International Championships. GOVERNING BODY

Since 2013, Child And Adult Safety Education Services, Inc. (CAASES), a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, has provided the administrative support and direction for the IASS. Shoot Right is the shooting division of CAASES and all sanctioning of shoots & shooting fees will be sent to Shoot Right.

Shoot Right exists to raise funding and other resources for Youth and Adult Development Programs in the shooting sports industry.

INTERINTERNATIONAL AIR SHOOTING SPORTS MISSION STATEMENT

The International Air Shooting Sports is a Youth and Adult Development Program where adult coaches and volunteers model sportsmanship, responsibility, and teamwork while using shooting sports programs to teach these and other positive life skills to IASS athletes.

PROGRAM DESIGN

Youth from ages 8-20, full-time college students, and adults ages 21 older are eligible to participate in the safe, educational, and enjoyable IASS handgun, semi-auto rifle and Tactical Shotgun sport of "speed shooting". IASS, like SCTP/SPP, is ideally suited to become a school sponsored Title IX sport. Similarly it offers an absolutely "level playing field" for gender participation in the shooting sports. The IASS is a perfect fit for youth organizations such as Boy Scouts, 4-H, Future Farmers of America, Police Athletic Leagues, Girl Scouts, Boys and Girls Clubs, etc. Any youth organization is welcome to participate in the IASS. This is a great training programs for all ages.

All IASS activities incorporate two indispensable elements – SAFETY AND FUN. Safety is incorporated into every aspect of ALL IASS activities. The learning environment at practices and at competitive shoots is designed to include the element of FUN for all participants. IASS participants learn the safe and responsible handling and use of pistols and semi-auto rifles. During this self-discovery process, team members develop proficiency in a sport that can be shared and enjoyed with family and friends for a lifetime.

ADULT LEADERSHIP

The program is led by trained and dedicated adult volunteer coaches who are committed to providing, promoting, and perpetuating opportunities for their young athletes to safely and enjoyably participate in a high-quality team-based sport. IASS coaches must take very seriously the responsibility of being good role models to the IASS Athletes.

HONORING THE GAME

Competition is clearly a part of the IASS, an indispensable part; but it is not the underlying principle. The "win-at-all-costs" philosophy has no place in the IASS. Striving to win while playing by the rules does. Honoring the game, exhibiting good sportsmanship, and being a responsible team member, are the bedrock values the IASS strives to instill. It is the DUTY of everyone involved in the IASS – coaches, parents, and athletes - to set good examples for IASS team and Individual members. Volunteers are expected to emulate and uphold high moral and ethical standards of personal conduct.

IASS Individual Membership

IASS membership includes a Membership to all IASS programs IASP, IA3G and IADS.

1 Year Adult = \$10

1 Year Junior = \$5*

*Through calendar year of 18th birthday - DOB Required

All clubs that sign up IASS members will be paid \$10 per membership. When a club reaches a minimum of \$50 the club will be paid out on 15th of each month or before the first of the next month.

Example: If your club writes 10 1 year Jr. or Adult memberships your club just raised \$100 for your clubs IASS program.

Individual membership fee payout: (Individual Fee Sharing)

Adult

1 Year Adult = \$45 - payout \$10

2 Year Adult = \$90 - payout \$20

3 Year Adult = \$135 - payout \$30

5 Year Adult = \$225 - payout \$50

Junior

1 Year Junior = \$35* - payout \$10

2 Year Junior = \$70* - payout \$20

3 Year Junior = \$105* - payout \$30

IASS Club/Team Membership Fee (No Fee Sharing)

The 1 year club fee is \$20 annually. Each club must be a member to participate in membership payout. Sanction regular matches, leagues and club information are added to the web site.

1. IASS GROUPING ATHLETES - Divisions

A. DIVISIONS

There are twenty competitive Divisions. These Divisions are designed to allow participants to compete on a level playing field.

All participants in the IASS must be registered and on a specific team if applicable. Teams may be composed of members from neighborhoods, houses of worship, gun clubs, and youth groups such as 4-H Clubs, Boy Scout Troops, FFA Chapters, J.R.O.T.C. Programs, Venturing Crews, Girl Scouts, Police Athletic Leagues, American Legion Posts, and V.F.W. Posts, to name but a few. Students attending a school sponsoring an IASS team are encouraged to shoot for their school.

<u>IMPORTANT! PLEASE NOTE:</u> State programs may not impose more stringent rules on team composition. Please contact your State Advisor for details pertaining to your state's IASS guidelines. Your State Advisor's contact information is listed on the IASS Website at <u>www.shootrightaz.org</u>. If your state has created its own IASS State Website, the link will be listed under the State Advisor's contact information.

Squads are organized based on age: Mentor Division (ages 8-11) Junior Division (ages 12-16) Senior Junior (ages 17-20) College (no age limit)

In the event a squad has both Junior and Senior Junior Division members, in order to complete a squad the entire squad will be required to compete in the Senior Junior Division.

Collegiate Division is open to all students enrolled in a post-secondary school such as a junior college, college, university, etc. and must be a full time student and in good academic standing. There is no age limit to Collegiate Division as long as they meet the current requirements.

Athletes may participate in both pistol and rifle airgun and airsoft, but not the discipline in the same match.

2. IASS DISCIPLINES AND SANCTIONING BODIES

A. **DISCIPLINES**

The International Air Shooting Sports Programs offers opportunities for individuals and teams to participate in the discipline of speed shooting.

B. SANCTIONING BODY

Shoot Right (<u>www.shootrightaz.org</u>) is the sanctioning body for the International Air Shooting Sports (IASS) Program. The IASS's international program staff is responsible for the management of the IASS.

3. IASS PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY

A. STUDENT STATUS AND AGE

All school-age boys and girls ages 8 - 20 that have the physical, mental, and emotional maturity to participate in an individual or team sport are eligible to participate in the IASS. There is also a IASS College Division for college-aged participants. Participants must be bona fide students enrolled in an accredited school, home schooled program, college or university. The athlete must be deemed <u>academically eligible</u> to participate in school-sponsored sports programs.

The IASS Junior and Senior Program eligibility ends once a student reaches his/her 20th birthday. If a student enrolls in IASS before turning 20 and then turns 20 during the target year, they will be allowed to finish out that target year. The IASS International Program Staff has the option to grant a variance for age in view of special circumstances.

Some states have a minimum legal age requirement for Pistol/Rifle airgun and airsoft – check your state/country laws!

B. ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must make satisfactory academic progress and be deemed eligible by school officials of their home school for participation in the school's extra-curricular activities including school sports.

C. CONDUCT

ALL individuals REGISTERED with the IASS (athletes, head coaches, and assistant coaches/adult volunteers) and those ASSOCIATED with the IASS (parents and family members, etc.) MUST comply with the conduct requirements stated in the Sportsmanship Contract.

IMPORTANT! PLEASE NOTE: Breaches of the SPIRIT as well as the LETTER of IASS Rules including stipulations in the Sportsmanship Contract WILL be grounds for SUSPENSION or EXPULSION from the program.

4. IASS TEAMS - Definition of Terms

A. TEAM FOCUS

The IASS is an individual and TEAM-BASED Youth and Adult Development Program. The intent of the IASS is to also provide participants with the opportunity to be a member of a TEAM. A team is composed of a group of individuals who are committed to a common goal and who work together regularly to achieve that goal. Ultimately, to achieve this unity of purpose, team members should spend quality time together in activities other than just shooting. Team members are required to practice on a regular basis with their team (See Section 5-B, Required Practices) and are expected to participate in team fundraising efforts and community service projects.

B. <u>DEFINITION OF IASS TEAM</u>

An IASS Team is defined as one or more individual Athletes registered by and guided by a Head Coach. There is no upper limit to the number of Athletes on a team.

C. DISTINCTION BETWEEN TEAM AND SQUAD

A **TEAM** is the entire group of Athletes registered under a Head Coach. Each team is assigned a Team ID Number. **A SQUAD** is the competitive unit for every IASS competition.

D. COMPETITIVE SQUAD

An IASS Squad that meets the Division criteria is considered a valid <u>COMPETITIVE SQUAD</u> and is eligible to enter and compete at the IASS State and International Team Championships. A valid Competitive Squad is Four (4) Athletes. There is NO LIMIT to the number of individuals that can be registered on a Team; thus, no limit to the number of Squads per Team. <u>SEVERAL Squads on a single TEAM may be entered in the same competition.</u>

E. IRREVOCABLE DECISION

Participants may not be a member of nor compete for more than one team in any one IASS season. Once a participant registers with a team, the decision is an irrevocable one that remains in effect for the entire IASS season.

F. "CHERRY PICKING"

"Cherry Picking" individuals from within or from outside a state to form either a local team or a "State All-Star Team" is strictly prohibited. "Cherry Picking" is putting together a group of "hot shots", "all-stars" or a "Paper Team" to compete at IASS State or International Team Championships. This practice runs counter to the letter and the spirit of the IASS and is expressly prohibited. ATHLETES AND/OR COACHES VIOLATING THIS RULE WILL BE SUSPENDED AND MAY BE REMOVED FROM THE PROGRAM!

Competition Shoots are not to be counted as practice sessions.

G. ATHLETE'S ELIGIBILITY FOR IASS COMPETITIONS

IASS Junior and Senior Divisions are based on ages. If a shooter ages out of a division during the target year, they will be allowed to finish out that target year. Participants must be bona fide students enrolled in an accredited school, home schooled program, college or university. The Athlete must be deemed **academically eligible** to participate in school-sponsored sports programs.

5. IASS TEAM REQUIREMENTS

A. HEAD COACH

Every Team MUST have a Head Coach who is 21 years of age or older. The first and foremost responsibility of the Head Coach is to ENSURE THE SAFETY of all participants. Head Coaches MUST emphasize the safe handling and use of pistols and semi-auto rifles in every facet of the International Air Shooting Sports and must be willing to conduct the "Required Practices" as stipulated below in Section 5B.

<u>IMPORTANT! PLEASE NOTE:</u> For all IASS events (practices, matches, etc.), team members must be under the supervision of the Team's Head Coach. In the event the Head Coach cannot be present, he/she must designate an Assistant Coach/Adult Volunteer who is registered with the International Organization and covered by the Head Coach's affiliated club insurance. Proof of insurance must be submitted with the registration. Violation of this rule disqualifies the Team from entering an event, and may result in the removal of the Head Coach from the IASS.

B. REQUIRED PRACTICES

Coaches must conduct a minimum of SIX (6) team practice sessions, and submit a copy of the schedule/roster on a quarterly basis to the International Organization.

Team members must attend a minimum of SIX (6) team practice sessions in order to be eligible to shoot in a IASS State or International Championship event representing that team. In the event an Athlete lives more than 50 miles away from the local shooting range, verification of eligible practices may be required.

Competition Shoots are not to be counted as practice sessions.

C. ATHLETE OR TEAM FUNDING

A Team is responsible for its own funding, including practice, travel, and shoot fees.

6. IASS STATE ADVISOR, HEAD & ASSISTANT COACH/ADULT VOLUNTEER – Registration

A. <u>STATE ADVISOR/Director – (Must be 21 years of age or older)</u>

A State Advisor's involvement in the IASS shall be strictly as a volunteer interested in promoting IASS activities within the Advisor's state and whose service is solely at the discretion and approval of the IASS International Office.

- 1. State Adviser/State Head coach: Must take Shoot Right Level-3 course and the ASEP Directing Youth Sports Programs online or classroom course. To be an effective youth and adult sport program director, it is necessary to know a little about everything. Finance. Human resources. Risk management. Marketing. Event planning. ASEP's Directing Youth Sports Programs online or classroom course is your vehicle for putting that knowledge into practice by giving you the tools you need to get the job done.
- 2. Must be NRA CRSO Certified
- 3. Must be NRA NCDS Pistol Certified
- 4. State Advisor/Director will conduct the Shoot Right training in his/her state and be willing to help surrounding states or provinces.

B. COACH/ADULT VOLUNTEER REGISTRATION REQUIRED

The Head Coach and all Assistant Coaches/Adult Volunteers MUST register with the IASS. An Assistant

Coach/Adult Volunteer is any adult working with one or more IASS Athletes where they have direct control of the Athlete(s).

All Volunteer Parents: Anyone wishing to participate in and help with the IASS is eligible to become a
volunteer parent. Some training is required, and all volunteers must be supervised by full-time coaches. It
is highly recommended that all volunteers also download the ASEP SportParent Survival Guide and bring
to the 2 hour in-person clinic run by head coach. All parents who wish to help need to take a first steps
pistol and rifle course.

C. <u>HEAD COACH REGISTRATION - (Must be 21 years of age or older)</u>

IASS Head Coaches are required to complete the Head Coach Registration form and fully register with IASS

- 1. **Head coach:** Must take Shoot Right Level-2 course and the following online ASEP courses:
 - Coaching Principles Online or
 - Coaching Principles Classroom and
 - Sport First Aid Online or
 - Sport First Aid Classroom

2. Must be RSO certified

Each State Advisor and Head Coach will have his/her contact information posted on the IASS Website (www.shootrightaz.org) for prospective participants looking to join a IASS Team/club in their area or for other Teams/clubs looking for Team/club competition. Listings will be by state and will include name, email address, telephone number, and city/town.

D. ASSISTANT COACH/ADULT VOLUNTEER REGISTRATION – (21 years of age or older)

IASS Assistant Coaches/Adult Volunteers are required to complete the registration process before working with Athletes.

1. Assistant coach: Must take Shoot Right Level-1 course and ASEP Coaching Essentials online course.

<u>IMPORTANT! PLEASE NOTE:</u> Your Head Coach must already be registered and have identified individual shooters and/or created a Team before Assistant Coaches/Adult Volunteers can begin their registration.

E. <u>ACCEPTED COACH CREDENTIALS</u>

A qualified coach MUST be on the field at all times when an IASS Athlete or Team is practicing or competing. Credentials from the following certificated coach training programs are accepted:

- ▶ Shoot Right Pistol Coach Level 1-3
- ▶ NRA Pistol Coach Level 1-3 (must get Shoot Right Coach Certification within 6 months)
- ▶ NRA Certified Pistol Instructor Certification (must get Shoot Right Coach Certification within 6 months)
- ▶ 4-H Shooting Sports Pistol Certification (must get Shoot Right Coach Certification within 6 months)

Other certificated programs may qualify. Please contact the IASS International Administrative Office for determination.

7. IASS ATHLETE AND TEAM - Registration Procedures

A. ATHLETE AND TEAM REGISTRATION

Each registered Head Coach is <u>responsible</u> for <u>registering</u> his/her Individual shooters and/or Team by following the process below:

1. Log on to the IASS Website at www.shootrightaz.org

Click **Print Forms**, download and print copies of each form listed below. Make a copy of each form for the number of Athletes you plan to register and distribute the forms to Athletes or their parents to complete, sign, and return to you.

- Athlete Registration Athlete Code of conduct (IASS Form " AC of C")
- Sportsmanship Contract (IASS Form "SC")
- Medical Consent (IASS Form "MC")

Collect the completed and signed copy of each form for every Athlete you plan to register BEFORE beginning the on-line Team Registration process.

2. Log on to the IASS Website at www.shootrightaz.org

3. Membership

Each club that signs up a member will receive \$10 per member (new or renew) as a fundraiser.

Input your User ID and Password to access **Manage Teams > add new Team** for creating your Team. Follow the onscreen directions to complete the Registration.

Once the Team is registered, click on **Manage Individuals and Teams > Athletes > Add New Athlete** button to complete the on-line Roster process. <u>The Athlete Registration-Consent & Waiver Form registers individual Athletes, the Team Registration Form registers the Team with the IASS.</u>

To pay the Athlete Registration Fee, go to **Manage Individuals/Teams > Missing Payments.** There you can choose to Pay by Check or Pay by Credit Card.

<u>HEAD COACHES OF RETURNING TEAMS:</u> There is no need to re-register, just update your Team's information using 'EDIT' under Manage Teams.

After updating your Team's information, click on:

- Manage Teams > Athletes > edit to update an Athlete's profile.
- To delete or add an Athlete, go to **Manage Teams > Athletes** and follow the on-screen directions.
- ▶ To pay the Athlete Registration Fee, go to **Manage Teams > Missing Payments.** There you can choose to Pay by Check or Pay by Credit Card.

4. Mail Forms to IASS International Administrative Office

Copies of the Athlete Registration/Consent/Medical Release & Athlete Conduct Forms should be sent to the IASS International Administrative Office for each Athlete registered. No one will be registered without these forms on file at the IASS International Administrative Office. These forms are required for ALL registered Athletes even if they are 18 years of age or older. A parent or legal guardian's signature is required for anyone under 18 years of age.

The **Head Coach** keeps a copy of the **Consent & Form**, along with the **Sportsmanship Contract and Medical Consent Form** with original signature (signed in ink) on file. For your protection, please retain copies of ALL forms submitted to the IASS International Administrative Office.

B. REGISTRATION DEADLINE

The DEADLINE for **TEAM** Registration is **thirty (30) days PRIOR** to the IASS State Team Championship. The online registration system will be locked out the following day. Head Coaches wishing to register Teams or add Athletes to their Team Roster after that date must contact the IASS International Administrative Office.

8. IASS IMPORTANT INFORMATION

A. SOLICITATION ACTIVITIES

Organizations and individuals desiring to solicit financial contributions or other assistance from local businesses or other third parties to support their participation in the IASS must do so in their own names.

Organizations and individuals are strictly prohibited from using the IASS name and IASS's non-profit classification or claiming affiliation with the IASS or any of the IASS's affiliate companies in their solicitation activities, without the sole written consent of the IASS.

Organizations and individuals accepting financial contributions or other assistance in connection with their participation in the IASS shall be solely responsible for collecting, recording, disseminating, substantiating and reporting all contributions or support they receive. Neither the IASS nor the IASS shall be responsible for any activities that organizations or individuals may engage in with respect to their participation in the IASS. Any questions regarding tax deductibility should be directed to your financial advisor.

B. IASS LOGO

Coaches, RSO's and Shooters do not call or refer to the guns in the International Air Shooting Sports during a training, practice, match, league or a recruiting time as a Firearm or Weapon. This can result in you and or your club to lose it's/or your privilege to participate in the IASS. If you lose personal privilege you must petition your state adviser and IASS. If your club loses its privilege to participate in the IASS and it also forfeits it's rights to all membership payout fee's that would come to the club.
